Forty years ago this month the Mt. Airy V.H.F. Radio Club was born. The above group of Philadelphia area Hams along with W3KKN and a continually growing list of active VHFers established the guiding principals which we still follow today. For the past few days I have been reading the recorded minutes from the first 10 years of club meetings. I m only half way through it but it is so fascinating (and many times so funny) that I have had a hard time putting it down. In honor of the Club anniversary and our founding fathers I d like to share a few of the events recorded in the club minutes from those early years.

The Organizational meeting of the Mt. Airy VHF Club was held on May 15, 1956. A month later they already had their nick name. The Packrats. For the first few months the club did not have a formal constitution or provision for membership dues, so they passed the hat around at each meeting. By the third meeting the club treasury had swelled to the sum of \$12.25 and so, in classic Packrat style, they decided to hold the first annual club picnic the following month! Bankruptcy was forestalled by holding a raffle at the picnic and collecting the deposit on the empty bottles.

The first Ladies Night occurred at the November 56 meeting and it was a very different event from the one we know today. The YL s and XYL s of the club officers and members were put in charge and conducted the business portion of the meeting. Upon adjourning they settled back and watched a sports film on ice skating and home movies from the August picture.

Although the original charter of the club was 2 meters and up, they decided that to have a chance at witning the January contest the club had to be on 6 meters. The clubs first January contest effort had 27 entries and a total score of 50,177 pts. Top Club Score was W3KKN with 8,136. (The club did not win its first gavel until 1961).

The Packrat Monday Night nets started in late April 1957 on the club frequency of 144.2 MHz. The 6 meter net was initiated in November and a few months later the 220 MHz net began.


Pack Rats Announce Nostalgia Night May 16th ! 🞺

MINUTES OF ORGANIZATION MEETING MAY 15, 1956

The following was taken directly from the club archives. It has been faithfully reproduced exactly as recorded in the Packrat scriptures.

On the evening of May 15, 1956 a group of Hams met at the QTH of Oscar Jacoby, W3FSC, for the purpose of organizing a V.H.F. Club. After serious discussion and the views of each Ham present taken into consideration, the following principles were adopted.

- 1) Membership shall be by invitation only, and a limit to be set
- 2) To qualify for membership a Ham must be active on the V.H.F. bands, 2 meters and up.
- 3) The purpose of the club shall be to promote interest in V.H.F. activity and improvement of existing equipment.
- 4) To help one another, join in any club sponsored event 100%.
- 5) The club shall meet once a month.
- 6) The club frequency shall be 144.2 MC, and members will be provided with crystals.
- 7) W3IBH was appointed President and W3SAO Secretary.
