LEAP into the MICROWAVES By: Ron Whitsel WA3AXV

"Leap into the Microwave" night kicked off on leapday, Thursday February 29. All indications were that this latest endeavor by the Pack Rats was a huge success. The intent of the now monthly event is to increase activity on our precious microwave frequencies and at the same time provide a pool of active stations for testing equipment and maybe even working a new grid. I think we had a good start at meeting these goals.

Bill, AA2UK, started the evening on 144,260 MHz and 222,980 MHz (Pack Rat Repeater) promptly at 2000 hours. There were about ten eager check-ins right at the start. Stations immediately caught on to the action and picked liaison frequencies to coordinate microwave contacts. This went on for the scheduled 2 hour period and beyond. In all I logged at least 20 check-ins through out the evening. After the initial flurry of activity the event kind of ran itself. The stations coming back to 144.260 MHz to look for new stations to work. Many new grids were worked on the bands from 900 MHz to 10 GHz. WA1YHO-FN42, W3IP-FM19. WA2TEO-FN31, WA4VHF-FM19 and AA2UK-FM29 along with a host of FN20 stations were some of the areas represented.



The March 1996 copy of the N.E.W.S. Letter has an article by Bruce, N2LIV, on modifications to the Kenwood TS-450S and TS-690S to convert them to low power for driving transverters.

The Northern Lights Radio Society will again sponsor the "Summer All-Band Sprint". This three hour event will be held on Monday, July 8th. This is an all-band sprint (50 MHz and up), as the title suggests, and uses the same scoring as the June VHF QSO Party. Complete rules will be sent out on the reflector in Spring and will be in all the magazines. Last years Summer sprint featured activity in all areas of the US and Canada and good 6 meter propagation. Spread the word! 73's Rich N0HJZ (EN34) 50-2304 MHz-

MFJ has a new 6 Meter Transceiver available. The model 9406 was designed by Rick, K1BQT, and covers USB with CW as an add on module. Power output is 10 watts PEP or approximately 8 watts CW. Frequency coverage is 50.000 to 50.300 MHz. The price is \$249.95, the CW board is \$39.95, and the microphone is \$10.00.

Ten-tec now has a 2 Meter to 6 Meter Transverter available. The Model 1209 unit will be available in February. Power output is 10 watts. Frequency coverage is 50 to 54 MHz. The price is \$95 for the kit and \$159 for a factory assembled unit. There is also a 20 meter to 6 meter version available for the same price with a frequency coverage of 50,000 to 50,350 MHz. Both units use rf switching and PIN diode switches for the T/R relay.
