NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. ICOM 451A: The new Icom 451A multimode rig covers 430-440 or 440-450 Mhz ranges. One would be of interest to the FM crowd at the high end of the band, the low range version would appeal to the SSB operators down at 432 Mhz. Three memories are built in, along with programmable band scan. Transmitter output is rated at 10 watts. Digital readout of frequency is featured just as in the 6 meter and 2 meter units from Icom. Price \$899.95.
- 2. MICROWAVE CONVERTER: The new Lab-Tronics VTC 13-3 covers the range 2000 to 2500 Mhz for use in the ham band at 2304 and HBO channel at 2150 Mhz. IF output frequency is 54 to 72 Mhz. (Channel 2,3,4 TV) Oscillator is voltage tuned for remote operation. Kit of parts is supplied complete with circuit board. P.C. board is available as a separate item. Price \$40., PC only \$15., P.O. Box 171, Rogers MN 55374
- 3. COAX SEAL: Universal Electronics is selling rolls of plastic mastic material suitable for sealing coax fittings. To use, one removes about 6 inches from the roll and wraps starting at the fitting end, working toward the connection. The material is then kneaded to form a smooth surface. The seal can be removed and replaced with the same material. Will adhere to polyvinyl coax jackets. Price \$ 4.00 for 2 rolls, 1280 Aida Drive, Reynoldsburg, Ohio 43068

ARRL BULLETIN NR 53 FROM ARRL HEADQUARTERS NEWINGTON CT MAY 21, 1981 TO ALL RADIO AMATEURS $\overline{\text{BT}}$

The Federal Communications Commission decided today to lift most restrictions on the amateur 1800 to 2000 kHz band. Some protection must remain for Canadian LORAN stations in the northeast operating on 1950 kHz. Accordingly, some band segment and power restrictions remain, with respect to 1900 to 2000 kHz. All restrictions will be lifted from the frequencies 1800 to 1900 kHz. The effective date has not been released but should be within the next two months. If we are having problems, we'll have to get them known to the FCC if we expect any regulations to be made to help us in the future.
