NEW PRODUCTS OF INTEREST TO HAMS By Lyn, W3NSI

- 1. PORTABLE COUNTER: The Trionyx TR 1000 is a 7 digit, compact (3 $3/4 \times 5 \times 5 \times 1/2$) battery operated counter covering the frequency range 10 Hz to 600 Mhz. A demo unit was borrowed from Hamtronics of Trevose, Pa. for evaluation. The TR1000 package includes a set of nicad batteries and AC P.S. charger unit, also a whip antenna that plugs into the front panel jacks. One jack is for the low freq. range up to 50 Mhz, the other goes through the prescaler to cover up to 600 Mhz. The counter is well built, with a thick aluminum case, and good quality circuit board. Sensitivity is rated at 15 mv at 30 Mhz and 50 mv at 450 Mhz. Stability is rated at 1 PPM from 20-40° c-which is about par for counters in this price range. The on/off switch is in back, which may not be so handy when used on a shelf, but would not be a problem the way a small counter like this would tend to be operated. Price \$159. 6219 Coffman Rd., Indianapolis, Ind. 46268
- 2. KENWOOD TR 7800: The latest FM rig from Kenwood has some interesting features. There are 15 memory channels with battery backup, so that the rig may be moved from car to fixed operation without loss of set-ups. The built-in keyboard is used for frequency selection, memory programming, scanner control, and autopatch operation. Transmit power is 25 watts in high and 5 watts (adjustable) in low. An LED bar meter is used in place of the usual analog instrument to read S meter and RF output. Push buttons on the Mic control up/down freq. scan in 5 or 10 Khz steps. Mode on this radio is FM only. Cost \$400.

WHF/UHF REPORT By Jo. W2EIF

The six meter band has not produced as many Es openings this year as compared to the last two years. However, it is claimed by some sources that Es declines during high sun spot periods, so maybe theory is being confirmed. There have been a few good openings but not as might be expected.

According to W2AXU, there has been considerable sun spot activity in July with SID's and Flairs, but no aurora or associated activity on the bands.

July 14 produced an opening to the Midwest which was good thru 432. The band was open on the 13th late and on the 14th early AM. ZB2BL was in on 6 meters on the afternoons of the 15th and 16th. He was worked by many on the East Coast the evening of the 16th also.

July 17th produced what may be the best Es session of the year for 2 meters. The band was open to ARK, OKLA, and TEXAS from about 1730 to 2030 GMT. After a fade out of about 2 hours, the band opened to IOWA, MO, KAN, NEB and South Dakota and very strong signals were available until about 0230 GMT on the 18th.

The signals seemed to be better from the Midwest to the Northeast states. South Jersey seemed to be on the fringe as usual, but I was able to work all the states from Texas North to South Dakota.

NOTE: It is reported that VEIASJ worked across the North Pole to JA9 on July 18, 1980 at 2300 GMT.

WA3AAJ, Jim Ward and family visited the Ontario Science Center in Canada on a recent vacation - Jim gives the place an FB upcheck.


Our printer, Ralph, WA3FOF, showed up at our last meeting with his girl friend Lynda - Nice couple!




