#### POSSIBILITY OF STRANGE SIGNAL ON 50 MHZ BAND By John B. Power, W2AXU

The age of solid state digital electronics is upon us. We all must have a digital clock in the ham shack these days. Its the in thing. And one that uses a crystal controlled ime base instead of the 60 Hz line frequency will provide very accurate time for so little money.

Now, a strange CW signal shows up on the low end of 50 MHz around 50.113 MHz. It can be a bit puzz-ling for a while, until you get the digital calculator out and start strum ing the key board.

The crystal for the clock time base is usually 3579.545 KHz. This is also the TV color burst frequency. The crystal is operated into an oscillator-divider chip, an MM6369, the output of which is 60 Hz. It is a 60 Hz square wave. The 3579.545 KHz is also present and it is also a very excellent square wave. We all know that square waves are rich in harmonics and so is this one. The 14th harmonic of the 3579.545 KHz crystal is 50.11363 MHz, and, incidentally, the 41st harmonic is 146.76134 MHz. There will also be signals in other parts of the radio spectrum as well every 3579.545 KHz. These frequencies will be very accurate and, therefore, can be used for calibration purposes.

There is a means to calibrate this crystal as well as other crystal standards via your color TV set. The method was developed at the National Bureau of Standards in Boulder, Colo. about 1968. It makes use of the extremely accurate color burst frequency transmitted in a network program transmission. This frequency is checked weekly by NBS for each network and the results published. If you use the color burst frequency method of calibration, your instrument calibrations can be traceable to the National Bureau of Standards.

It is clear that if the predictions hold true, cycle 21 will be a wopper and will likely parallel cycle 18 and have an impact almost as severe as cycle 19. During periods of high solar activity many services will be detrimentally affected. Satellite damage from solar radiation is one example. Communications and power will be interrupted. VLF Omega Navigation alert used on overseas aircraft would likely be affected rendering the service at times, next to useless. Worse may be the impossibility of warning users that the system is failing. Space travel and related health hazards will become a significant factor to take into account.

Magnetometer survey work for natural resources will be affected to such an extent that at time the investigations would have to be curtailed with a severe cost impact on such resources even before production. CB Radio on HF will likely be sheer havoc with the skip iterference. And now there is new evidence to support the theory that the weather is irectly affected by solar sunspot behavior and geomagnetic occurrences previously thought to be unrelated.

HR REPORT feels that the amateur community should be made aware of a highly accurate prediction that may well not only affect our use of the radio spectrum, but likely our daily lives and our destiny. By W9RX




