A REPORT FROM YOUR ARRL DIRECTOR

A few issues ago, we quoted a letter received from Gilbert L. Crossley. ARRL Director, Atlantic Division, regarding the substitution of the number 0 for the letterO on the license plates. Each HAM in Pennsylvania, with the letter O in his call, received a letter from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles stating that the plates were legal, even though the substitution was made. They explained that the letter O is used only for buses and taxis, and then at the end. It looked as though everyone who applied for his call was stuck for five years with the wrong license number. It seems as though Gil was not satisfied with this decision, and the following is a direct quote from a card received from him, dated July 25, 1958.

"Dear Fellow Radio Amateur:

After 4 trips to Harrisburg for conferences, the last held July 16th, with representatives of the Tag Division, Motor Vehicles, Revenue and the Dep. Attorney General, I received, this afternoon, a phone call from Mr. Reco-Revenue stating that the previous decision relative to the substitution of the zero for the "0" has been reversed.

DO NOT WRITE - Give then time - at least a week. A letter of procedure will be sent each concerned relative to the method to be used in the plate exchange when the new plates are ready. Please be assured that all of my meetings have been very cordial. CUL 73.

Radiation of harmonics by anateurs in violation of FCC rules continues to require attention. To avoid violations, FCC urges never amateurs especially to make sure their transmitters are tuned to the desired output frequency and not to any harmonic. All Amateurs should also have others nearby check their signals for harmonics and send word to any heard in the 11; 5.4, 7.4 MC or other frequency ranges. Corrective or after Nevember 15, 1945. TVI SERVICE

Here is the information needed to give any complainent of TVI. If your complainent has:

RCA -- "G" Street & Wyoning Avenue MOTORCIA -- 30th & Chestnut Streets ZENITH -- Pierce Phelps 5900 Upland Way ADMIRAL -- 12th Street & Glenwood Ave. PHILCO -- 2030 Upland Way EMERSON -- 223 N. Broad Street SYLVANIA -- 32nd Street & Walnut Street

These distributors will supply the complainent with a Drake Filter free of charge.

Explain to them that they must supply the distributor with the type of disturbance, call letters and model number of their set. Also explain that the best time to have the filter installed is in the evening or on a Saturday, when you are home and are able to coperate with the serviceman.

The best thing to do, if it is your first complaint, is to have them write to Roger Phelps at the FCC, giving the same information, and have your rig cleared by a TVI Committee. If your rig is clear, the FCC will notify the manufacturer to have the set filtered.

The ARRL recommends, that by all means, you are not to touch a complainents set.

Omitted in the above list was SILVER-TONE. The owners of Silvertone TV's should contact Sears & Roebuck Service.

FROM K3CRJ -- A EROTHER RAT

A V.H.F. CHALLENGE:

If you really want to see how far a 108 mc signal can be received, try tuning in on the 10 mw transmissions from the Satellites. One local amateur has received signals over a 4000 mile path:

It isn't too hard to change a 2M Yagi to 108 me by slipping split tubing over the elements to lengthen them. But it will take a low noise front end converter and about the last squeak of reception technique to hear such signals.

Due to the constantly changing orbit of the Satellites, it is helpful to know when to listen. Tune in the nightly broadcast of VPO on 4275 kc at 7, 8, or 9 P.M. EST -- and you can quickly find out the best times. A terrestial globe is useful to locate the positions given.

You will have to listen to a lot of noise, but you can finally hear the rarest of space signals direct -- and hang up your own record. And all the things you learn about improving your reception (until you hear the signal) can also be used to improve 2 meter reception too; (Thanks Newell)

SEPTEMBER MEETING


