ARRL BULLETINS

Extracted From NR 219, May 4, 1969

The ARRL Board of Directors held its annual meeting at New Orleans May 2 and 3, 1969. Among its actions are requests to FCC for technician privileges in the whole two meter band and on 29.5 to 29.7 MHz, a one year wait for extra class instead of the present two years, and multiple speeds for RTTY

ARRL will also support 7 MHz maritime mobile operation, RTTY on 28.0 to 28.5 MHz and a move of the CW band on two meters to the low end. VHF repeaters will be covered each month in the VHF column of QST and there will be repeater information in the 1970 handbook. A separate booklet on repeaters was authorized, as well as a beginners book for junior high school students. There will be an attempt to get courses on amateur radio into more schools. In league affairs, the Board decided on an additional meeting scheduled for November 1, 1969.

A VHF beacon will be established and morning code practice from W1AW will be tested for six months.

The Board rejected motions to shift W1AW from its present frequencies, to start a propagation column and to ask for extra phone space for those areas of the U.S. outside the mainland. However, the Board will study expansion of the U.S. phone bands, in consultation with amateur radio societies in other countries.

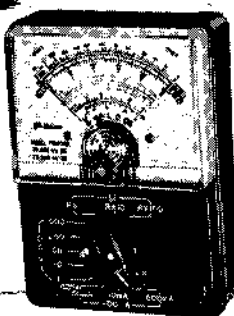

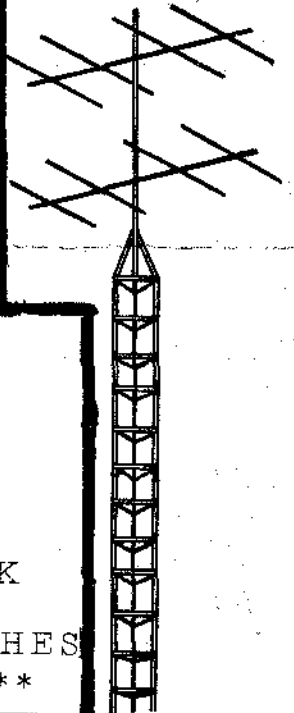

NEW TWO VOLUME SET TELLS HOW TO CHOOSE THE BEST HI-FI AND STEREO EQUIPMENT By Murray P. Rosenthal; Published by Hayden Book Company, Inc., New York
Volume I - 114 pages, illustrated paperback \$3.25
Volume II - 104 pages, illustrated paperbound \$3.25

How does the prospective buyer of hi-fi and stereo equipment spot those features which add up to the best possible equipment in a particular price range and avoid those which are well packaged, but low in quality? And how can the owner of a system improve his rig to gain increased listening pleasure? These are a few of the many questions answered in a practical two-volume paperback set by Murray P. Rosenthal, HOW TO SELECT AND USE HI-FI AND STEREO EQUIPMENT, published by Hayden Book Company, Inc., in the Rider Series.

Volume I, which concentrates on the basic hi-fi and stereo equipment, opens with a brief but very thorough discussion of acoustics. Written clearly, concisely, it gives the reader an excellent background, including the often overlooked relationship between enclosure, speaker and listening area. Criteria are given for selecting the various types of speakers. Cutting through the confusing array of enclosure types and sub-types the book tells just how different kinds of enclosures affect sound, and which kinds are particularly effective in given situations.

Headphones, preamplifiers, amplifiers, tuners and receivers are then discussed, showing a sampling of control features, connection possibilities, and a comparison of the advantages and disadvantages of tube vs. transistorized equipment.

Volume II fully discusses record players and tape recorders, components which may be added to the basic hi-fi or stereo rig at any time. It shows how different kinds of construction in these components can affect performance. Covering phono arms, pick-up types, styli, etc., it gives concrete reasons why certain kinds of equipment should be selected or avoided.

A particularly valuable feature of Volume II is a thorough troubleshooting guide. Here are 38 pages of tips on solid-state devices, tools, testing, for those listeners who want to keep their equipment in top working order.

Mr. Rosenthal has been intimately involved in hi-fi and stereo for 20 years, and is the author of FUNDAMENTALS OF RADIO, published by Hayden.

RADIO ANTENNA DRAWS IRE OF NEIGHBORS (Continued)

"Jay Rock Bucher, of 711 Michael Street, Ridley Park View, a ham radio operator, found himself the target of two petitions last night when he asked the Ridley Township commissioners about the legality of his antenna.

"Bucher said he understood the board has adopted a resolution against construction of a new ham antenna.

"Commissioner John Modesti then showed Bucher two petitions charging he has lengthened his antenna to 60 feet without a permit.

"Modesti said since Bucher lengthened the tower he has annoyed neighbors up to two and one-half blocks away. The commissioner said he has heard complaints from residents of Michael, Terra Villa and Lakeview Streets.

"The board of commissioners, after lengthy discussion, said it will arrange to meet with local ham operators, complainants and a member of the Federal Communications Commission.

"The board added that the recent resolution forbids construction of new antennas without approval from all members of the board and will remain in effect."

Everyone took his proper position except the little one who carried "O". He had forgotten where he was to stand. He hesitated quite a while, and then brought down the house by marching to the head of the group.

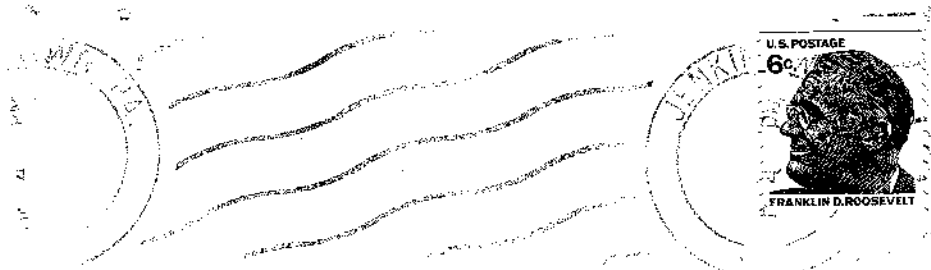
