Fellow Rats:

Its been some time since I took time off from regular activities to write you. What prompted this letter was the fact that I saw my call appear in the February issue and although I may (?) be falsely accused of same, I still am 100% behind every remark made by said editor of this namely article.

Holding the position as head of the Official Observers in the Eastern Pennsylvania Section, I can state the active OD sends in a discrepency report each month with from 10 to 25 calls listed. My station and I report upwards of 50 to 75 second harmonic cooperative reports each month. This, I think, is what the FCC is trying to battle.

In 9 out of 10 cases the novice or technician is not to be blamed completely. It is my assumption the most blame should lie on the higher class amateur operator who is teaching, or let me correct that statement. "Trying to teach the new-comer the tricks of the trade, as they say."

The neophyte today is more interested in that QSO plus QSL than in the manner he obtains it or the way his signal sounds in order to get it. I know this will raise the short hairs on some of the more experienced operator BUT stop and remenis; When was the last time you helped a fellow amateur find his trouble with 5 minutes of assisting data in a QSO followed by 15 minutes runaring his rig and signal into the dirt?

The data he received will not go unheaded but the 15 minute calling-down made him feel, "My rig worked you OK so I don't need to fix it." It's operating of this type that is getting us a bad nome in the eyes of our government and the FCC. Super-power, harmonics, off-frequency operation and bad sounding signals are the bulk of the FCC headaches. This letter is not intended to inform you on how to cope or straighten the problem out. However, I do contend if we help the other fellow once in a while then he of course has to bow a bit also and accept asisstance.

Then looking at it from the comical side of life, what fun would it be to tune across the bands without any QRM, no side-band splatter, but each and every QSO would be 100% perfect. I think I'd go nuts (no comment pse) because I would not be able to practice what I had been taught on how to get that QSO through. The new receiver with that super dooper mechanical filter, the Q-multiplier, the triple decker beam, (Am I Boreing you?) all them stager tuned RF and IF stages we just added to the receiver would be a waste of money. Because of recent ice-floe breakup, amateur 50 Mc work from Ice Station Charlie, originally scheduled to begin in February, will not be attempted. Instead, WlIJD and WlFVY will return to Fletchers Ice Island, T3, and resume operation on 50 Mc with the call sign KGIFN. Improved equipment is being taken to this expedition, with KG1FN expected to be in operation by early February. Beacon transmissions will be made at all hours, and two way work will be attempted when conditions appear favorable.

Experience reported in January QST show that the hours between 0400 and 1000 GMT were most productive, so this period will be watched most closely. Operating frequency will be 50.04 Mc. Anyone hearing or working KG1FN on 50 Mc is asked to report details to ARRL.
